

## **Draft Proposed Rules for Miloli'i Community-based Subsistence Fishing Area**

- 1. Boundaries for the CBSFA:** from Kīpahoe to Kaunā (18.6 miles) to a depth of 100 fathoms
- 2. Four Pu'uhonua** (rest zones to replenish the populations of fish allowing fish to spill over to other areas). In these areas people could only:
  - a. Fish with throw net and scoop nets from shore,
  - b. Fish with hook and line from shore or from a vessel,

In these areas, people would not be allowed to:

- c. No harvest of 'opihi
- d. No use of fishing gear other than throw net and scoop net from shore and hook and line from shore or from a vessel (so important to remember: no fishing using 3-prong, speargun or arbollet and no use of gill or cross net)

The four proposed Pu'uhonua are:

- a. Pu'uhonua Papa:** From Cinder Pile in Papa Bay to Makahiki Pt. - 1.95 miles or 1.19 sq. miles
- b. Pu'uhonua Honomalino:** From Honomalino (North side of bay) to Pukeokeo (near kiawe bush) - 1.24 miles or 1.1 sq. miles
- c. Pu'uhonua Kapua:** From South of Okoe Bay to Kaupō - 1.2 miles or 0.98 sq. miles
- d. Pu'uhonua Manukā:** From Manukā Bay North point to Manukā Bay South point - 0.86 miles or 0.37 sq. miles

### **3. Pāku'iku'i Pu'uhonua (Rest Area)**

From Makahiki Point to Honomalino Point – 2.55 miles or 1.57 sq. miles. There would be a pu'uhonua (rest area) where fishing of pāku'iku'i would not be allowed.

### **4. Miloli'i Bay: - Community Fishing Area:**

Since Miloli'i Bay is a special place, where we teach keiki to fish and go to get food, it would have special rules. From the Lighthouse to Laeloa point. – 0.39 miles or 0.19 sq. miles,

**People would not be allowed to:**

1. Use arbollete or speargun
2. To spear the following species with any gear: Uhu, Pāku'iku'i, Weke 'Ula, Moanakali, 'Ū'ū (menpachi)
3. Lay gill nets – daytime use only from shore
  - See existing state rules
  - No unattended nets for more than 30 minutes
  - Net dimensions – no larger than 7ft high and 125 ft wide, eye size 2 ¾ inch

### **5. 'Ōpelu Traditional Management Zone:**

1. From Napohakuloloa (2-stone) to Kapua – 8.11 miles or 6.29 sq. miles.
2. Closed to fishing for 'ōpelu during the traditional 'ōpelu kapu or closure time (February 1 – August 31 annually).
