

**Miloli‘i Community-based Subsistence Fishing Area: Proposed Species Rules:**

<p><b>A. Pāku‘iku‘i achilles tang</b> (<i>Acanthurus achilles</i>)</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Limit of 5 fish per day per person. Throw back if catch more than 5 in a net and they are still alive.</li> <li>2. Fish must be 5 inches or larger to harvest.</li> <li>3. (Also have the Pāku‘iku‘i Pu‘uhonua (Rest Area) from Makahiki Point to Honomalino Point)</li> </ol>
<p><b>B. Kole</b> (<i>Ctenochaetus strigosus</i>)</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Limit of 20 fish per day per person</li> <li>2. Minimum size 5 inches (can only harvest fish that are 5 inches and over)</li> <li>3. No harvesting during spawning season (March 1 – June 30)</li> </ol>
<p><b>C. ‘Ōpelu mackerel scad</b> (<i>Decapterus macarellus</i>)</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Minimum size suggestion is 12 inches (but still needs to be discussed).</li> <li>2. (Also have the ‘Ōpelu Traditional Management Zone From 2-stone to Kapua - fishing closed from February 1 – August 31 annually in the ‘Ōpelu Traditional Management Zone).</li> </ol>
<p><b>D. Uhu parrotfish two larger species:</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Red-lipped: palukaluka-female, ‘ele‘ele-male (<i>Scarus rubroviolaceus</i>)</li> <li>• Spectacled: ‘ahu‘ula-female, uliuli-male (<i>Chlorurus perspicillatus</i>)</li> </ul> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Limit of 1 red uhu (female) per day per person</li> <li>2. Minimum 14 inches - Maximum 20 inches</li> <li>3. No harvest March to May (3 months of spawning)</li> <li>4. No harvest of blue Uhu</li> <li>5. No night spearfishing</li> </ol>
<p><b>E. Uhu parrotfish all other species</b></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. limit of 1 blue and 2 red per person per day</li> </ol>
<p><b>F. ‘Ū‘ū soldierfish</b> (<i>Myripristis spp.</i>)</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. No harvest April to June (3 months of spawning)</li> </ol>
<p><b>G. ‘Opihi - limpets</b></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Makaiāuli (blackfoot / <i>Cellana exarata</i>) and ‘Ālinalina (yellowfoot / <i>Cellana sandwicensis</i>) - 1-gallon size ziplock bag per day/ per person (with shell)</li> <li>2. Kō‘ele (<i>Cellana talcosa</i>): No take in entire CBSFA.</li> <li>3. (Also, no harvest of all ‘opihi species in proposed pu‘uhonua)</li> </ol>
<p><b>H. ‘A‘ama – thin-shelled rock crab</b> (<i>Grapsus tenuicrustatus</i>)</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. No take females with eggs in entire managed area</li> </ol>
<p><b>I. Ula spiny lobster</b> (<i>Panularis spp.</i>)</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Limit 2 per day per person</li> </ol>
<p><b>J. Aquarium Fishing</b></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Want no aquarium fishing in entire CBSFA – back up is No aquarium fishing for pāku‘iku‘i and kole in the entire CBSFA boundaries</li> </ol>
